Since its founding in 2006, she has been advisor to the student editors of *The Young Scientists Journal*, and she chairs the journal's International Advisory Board. Her own publications include "Helping Young Scientists Speak for Themselves" (*Nature*, 460, 683 [6 August 2006]), and "Teaching Relativity to 10-Year-Olds" (*School Science Review*, March 2005, p. 34). She is also an accomplished singer who has performed Mozart solos in Sweden and elsewhere. **Paul Soderberg** was the founding Editor of *The Student Science Society Bulletin* at the International School Bangkok in 1966. He was a regular contributor to *The Bombay Journal of Natural History* and *The Natural History Bulletin* of the Siam Society. In 1977 he edited *The Big Book of Halls of Fame* (New York & London: RR Bowker, 1,072 pp.), and during the 1980s he edited the world's largest-circulation fine arts newspaper.
